12 DAYS

Traveling along the Croatian coastline aboard a small comfortable motorship might be the most idyllic solution for those dreaming about leisure, sunning, bathing and admiring charming shore sceneries. Embark in Dubrovnik, and continue north making stops in amazingly preserved medieval towns, discovering pristine nature, savoring delicious Mediterranean food, and creating special memories!

Day 1: Arrival to Dubrovnik

Transfer from Dubrovnik airport or from your Dubrovnik hotel to Cruz Harbor, where embarkation begins at noon. Meet your fellow travelers and your Cruise Manager later at an on-board Welcome reception. This evening, you can relax or take a walk through Dubrovnik's vibrant streets. Overnight in Dubrovnik onboard the motorship.

Day 2: Dubrovnik, Mljet, Korcula

After breakfast, start the day with a walking tour of Dubrovnik, the «Pearl of Adriatic» and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Visit the Rector's Palace and Franciscan Monastery's Pharmacy which is considered to be one of the oldest in Europe. As you dine onboard, set sail for Mljet Island. Mljet National Park features five types of forests, many species of birds, and two deep lakes, Veliko Jezero (Big Lake) and Malo Jezero (Small Lake). Enjoy the spectacular scenery and continue cruising to Korcula, believed to be the birthplace of the explorer Marco Polo. Dinner tonight is on board. Overnight in Korcula onboard the motorship.

Day 3: Korcula, Hvar

After breakfast, enjoy a walking tour of Korcula through its

narrow, cobbled streets. Visit the majestic Gothic-Baroque Cathedral of St. Mark. Board your boat for lunch and a swimming stop as you cruise. Late this afternoon arrive in Hvar. On a sightseeing tour see the first public theatre in Europe which is supposed to be older than Shakespeare's theatre in the UK, the Franciscan Monastery and much more. Your evening is free in Hvar. Explore the city as you please and dine on your own at one of many restaurants in town. Overnight in Hvar onboard the motorship.

Day 4: Hvar, Bol, Split

After breakfast, sail to Bol famed for the best beaches in Croatia, the Golden Horn. This vast, golden pebble beach is unique in that it changes shape and position depending on the winds. Over lunch on board, continue sailing to Split. Here, a walking tour shows off the historic inner city built around the Roman Emperor Diocletian's Palace, a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site. See the remnants of Split's Roman heritage, its Renaissance and Gothic buildings such as the Jupiter's Temple and the Cathedral. Evening is at leisure. Overnight in Split onboard the motorship.

Day 5: Split, Trogir, Sibenik

After breakfast, sail to Trogir, the UNESCO World Heritage Site, the city of Trogir. Explore the city at your own pace. Back on board, enjoy lunch as you cruise to Sibenik, with a stop on the way for a swim. Sibenik is the city in central Dalmatia, where the river Krka flows into the Adriatic Sea. During an afternoon walking tour around Sibenik get acquainted with the city and its magnificent medieval heart. Spend your evening as you please. Overnight in Sibenik onboard the motorship.





Day 6: Sibenik, Sali

After breakfast, enjoy Sibenik known as the gateway to the Krka National Park, famous for its breathtaking waterfalls. Another National Park, Kornati covers the area of more than 140 islands north-west. Enjoy both scenic destinations before you sail to Sali. Tonight, enjoy captain's dinner on board. Overnight in Sali onboard the motorship.

Day 7: Sali, Zadar

After breakfast, stop for a swim (weather permitting). Late this afternoon, arrive in Zadar. During a walking tour visit the historical center with its defensive walls built in 16th century, the ancient Port Gate where the Venetian lion still standing guard, the Square of the Five Wells, Church of St. Donat, the Roman Forum dating back to the 1st century BC and the largest cathedral in Dalmatia, St. Anastasia. Your evening is free. Overnight in Zadar onboard the motorship.

Day 8: Zadar, Opatija

Disembark after breakfast, bidding your crew farewell and journey north for a visit to Plitvice Lakes National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Have your camera ready as you take a walking tour around several of the lower lakes. Enjoy the breathtaking scenery of this natural wonder with its 16 terraced lakes surrounded by wooded mountains and lush vegetation. Then continue to Opatija. Dinner is at your hotel. Overnight in Opatija at a hotel.

Day 9: Pula & Rovinj Excursion

After breakfast, head to Pula and take an orientation tour of this strategic port since the times of the ancient Romans. Visit the Amphitheater, the sixth largest of its kind to be preserved in the world today. Continue to the beautiful resort of Rovinj with free time to explore the old town and its narrow lanes before we return to Opatija. Overnight in Opatija at a hotel.



Day 10: Opatija, Postojna, Venice

After breakfast, travel to Slovenia to visit the unique and beautiful Postojna Cave, one of the largest in Europe. Tour this fantastic subterranean world by miniature electric train. Now on to Venice, with its idyllic setting on 119 islands. Overnight in Venice at a hotel.

Day 11: Venice

After breakfast, begin our exploration of Venice with a boat ride to Murano Island, famous for its artistic glassware. Visit a glassblowing factory, where you will watch a demonstration of traditional Venetian glassblowing by master craftsmen.

Included:

- Arrival and departure transfers;
- 7 nights cruise from Dubrovnik to Zadar on board M/S Karizma in a cabin with private facilities;
- 4 nights in first class hotels, rooms with private facilities;
- Welcome cruise reception;
- Breakfast daily;
- 6 lunches, and 1 dinner aboard the ship;
- 1 captain's dinner with live music;
- Two dinners as per itinerary;
- Transportation by air-conditioned vehicles throughout the tour;



Then, on to St. Mark's Square, for the walking tour, visiting St. Mark's Basilica and the Doge's Palace – a remarkable representative of the Venetian Gothic style. Enjoy views of the Bell Tower and Bridge of Sighs, one of the most romantic city sites.

The rest of the day is at leisure to enjoy Venice at your own pace, to shop, or perhaps join an optional gondola ride. Later, we gather for a Farewell Dinner with new friends. Overnight in Venice at a hotel.

Day 12: Venice – Departure

After breakfast and check out, transfer to the airport.

Romania, Bulgaria, Macedonia and Serbia

13 DAYS

Day 1: Arrival to Bucharest

Arrive in Bucharest and transfer to Sinaia for dinner and overnight.

Day 2: Peles Castle, Bran Castle, Brasov

After breakfast, drive to Peles Castle, one of the most famous castles in Romania. It was the former summer residence of King Carol the 1st of Hohenzollern – Sigmaringen, built in the late 19th century. After lunch at a local restaurant, continue to Bran Castle, also known as «Dracula's castle», although it is one among several locations linked to the Dracula legend, including Poenari Castle and Huniad Castle. Return to Sinaia for a dinner and overnight.

Day 3: Brasov, Bucharest

After breakfast, transfer to Brasov to visit the imposing Black Church, the largest gothic style edifice between Vienna and Istanbul. Its name comes from the great fire in 1689 blackening the walls of the church. It has the largest church bell in the country weighting in at seven tons. After lunch at a local restaurant, continue to Bucharest for a dinner and overnight.

Day 4: Bucharest

After breakfast, discover Bucharest, Romania's capital and the largest city, as well as the most important industrial and commercial center of the country. Bucharest is the 6th largest city in the European Union by population within city limits, after London, Berlin, Madrid, Rome and Paris. Enjoy lunch at



a local restaurant. The rest of the day is at leisure.

Day 5: Arbanassi, Veliko Tarnovo

After breakfast, transfer to Arbanassi village, famous for its rich history and numerous historical monuments. One of the most impressive monuments is the Church of the Nativity of Christ. After lunch, continue to Veliko Tarnovo, also known as the city of the Tsars. Discover the mighty fortress and walk the streets of Tsarevets Castle. Dinner and overnight in Veliko Tarnovo.



Day 6: Plovdiv, Sofia

After breakfast, transfer to Sofia stopping in Plovdiv. Plovdiv is the second-largest city in Bulgaria and is an important economic, cultural, and educational center. Plovdiv has evidence of habitation since the 6th millennium BC when the first Neolithic settlements were established. It is said to be one of the oldest cities in the world. After lunch, continue to Sofia for a dinner and overnight.

Day 7: Sofia

After breakfast, discover Sofia, the capital and the largest city of Bulgaria. The city is located at the foot of Vitosha mountain in the Western part of the country. After lunch, visit Rila monastery, the largest and most famous Eastern Orthodox monastery in Bulgaria that houses the famous Rafail's cross (wooden crucifix) as well as works of art and documents of the Bulgarian civilization. Return to Sofia for a dinner and overnight.

Day 8: Skopje

After breakfast, transfer to Skopje. The rest of the day is at leisure.

Day 9: Skopje

After breakfast, discover Skopje, the capital and the largest city of the Republic of Macedonia. It is the country's political, cultural, economic and academic center. In the Roman period it was known as Scupi. Skopje has been occupied by many different empires since its foundation. However, the Ottomans left the greatest mark. They ruled Macedonia for hundreds of years and built a large number of mosques and other buildings. After lunch, continue to Matka, the narrow canyon of the lower course of the Treska river, covering roughly 5,000 hectares of beautiful lakes, steep sides of mountains, caves and picturesque medieval monasteries. Return to Skopje for a dinner and overnight.

Day 10: Belgrade

After breakfast, transfer to Belgrade. The rest of the day is at leisure.

Day 11: Belgrade

After breakfast, discover Belgrade, the capital and the largest city of Serbia. It is located at the confluence of the Sava and Danube rivers. Its name translates as «White city». Various styles of architecture dominate the city while its recent resurgence as the leading hub in South-Eastern Europe makes it a must-see destination. The rest of the day is at leisure.

Day 12: Novi Sad, Sremski Karlovci

After breakfast, drive to Novi Sad for a city tour, the second largest city in Serbia and the capital of the autonomous province of Vojvodina. After lunch, transfer to Sremski Karlovic. After the city tour, enjoy local wine tasting. Return to Belgrade for a dinner and overnight.

Day 13: Belgrade – Departure

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight home.

11 DAYS

Day 1: Arrival to Sofia

Arrive in Sofia and transfer to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 2: Sofia

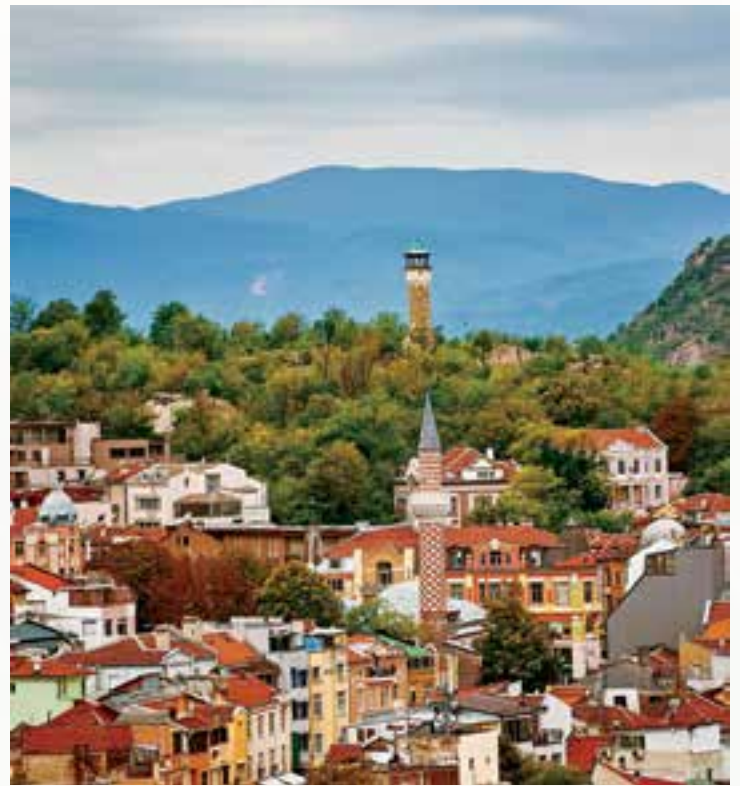
Enjoy the city tour of Bulgaria's capital Sofia, visit the Church of St. Sofia, the Church of St. George and the Aleksandar Nevski Memorial Cathedral. The pedestrianized center of Sofia is full of emblematic and interesting buildings such as the National Drama Theater, the former King's Palace, several churches, parks and historical sites. Visit Sofia's early-Christian Church of St. George, also known as the St. George Rotunda, originally built by Romans during the 4th century, making it one of Bulgaria's oldest buildings. The afternoon is at leisure. Enjoy dinner at a traditional restaurant.

Day 3: Sofia, Plovdiv (150 km)

After breakfast, drive to Plovdiv, a town that was built around seven hills, dating back to 4,000 years BC making it one of the oldest cities in Europe. In the 4th century BC it was conquered by Phillip of Macedonia. Visit the old town situated on Nebet Tepe hill to see the Ethnographic Museum, the Roman Theater and the Church of SS Kostantino and Elena. Transfer to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 4: Plovdiv, Rila, Skopje (Macedonia) (450 km)

After breakfast, drive to the magnificent Rila Monastery, the most important monument of the Orthodox faith in the Balkans (UNESCO). Its history is directly related to St. Ivan of Rila, a Bulgarian hermit who settled in the region and



devoted his life to fasting and prayers. The monastery was initially situated near the cave where the saint dwelled. After he passed away in 946, St. Ivan was buried in the cave in which he found solitude. Throughout the centuries Rila Monastery has always been the spiritual, educational and cultural center of Bulgaria. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant.





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Continue to North Macedonia. Transfer to Skopje for dinner and overnight.

Day 5: Skopje, Ohrid (180 km)

After breakfast, visit North Macedonia's capital Skopje, the Old Bazaar made of narrow streets. The pedestrian walk is comprised of similar, one floor structures that house shops containing jewels, carpets, clothes, books, etc. See the Mustafa Pasha Mosque (16th century) and the Church of St. Spas. Explore the Feudal Tower and the memorial dedicated to Mother Teresa. Transfer to Ohrid for dinner at a traditional restaurant and overnight.

Day 6: Ohrid

After breakfast, enjoy a boat tour on Lake Ohrid to the Monastery of Saint Naum near the border with Albania. In the afternoon, explore the old center of Ohrid, one of the most beautiful cities in Macedonia, and one of the most fascinating in the Balkan Peninsula. It was declared as a world heritage by UNESCO. Located on the eastern shore of Lake Ohrid, it is known for its pretty white houses, winding streets and art treasures. Visit the Cathedral of St. Sophia built in 1037-1056 with interesting frescoes of the 14th century, the Church of S. Bogorodica Perivlepta of 1259 with Byzantine forms, the Roman theatre, the Samuil fortress, the Plaosnik and the Church of St. Kaneo (one of the symbols of Ohrid). Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 7: Ohrid, Heraklea, Kalambaka (300 km)

After breakfast, drive to the ancient Roman city of Heraklea, founded by Philip II (4th century BC). The most interesting remains of the site are: the baths, the colonnade, the Amphitheatre and the remains of two basilicas. Both are decorated with splendid and colorful mosaics depicting geometric figures, trees, birds, flowers and animals. Continue to a Greek city of Kalambaka. Transfer to the look out of Psaropetra to enjoy the best panoramic views of Meteora and the sunset. Transfer to your hotel for dinner



and overnight.

Day 8: Kalambaka, Meteora, Vergina, Thessaloniki (240 km)

After breakfast, visit the Meteora monasteries: a unique experience of nature's grandeur in conjunction with history,





architecture and man's everlasting desire to connect with the Divine. Visit Varlaam Monastery and Roussanou Monastery. Head to the UNESCO site of Vergina to see the royal necropolis, believed to be the tomb of Philip II of Macedonia. The museum houses material found in the area is considered to be one of the greatest archaeological collections in all of Greece. Continue to Thessaloniki. Transfer to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 9: Thessaloniki, Mounth Athos, Thessaloniki (280 km)

After breakfast, drive to port Ouranoupolis for a mini cruise*

around Mount Athos, a fifty kilometers long cape, located in the eastern part of the Halkidiki Peninsula. During the cruise you can admire eight of the twenty monasteries, which surprisingly adhere to the spurs on the shore. Return to Thessaloniki for dinner and overnight.

**In case of bad weather an excursion will be made to Kavala and the archaeological sites of Amphipolis and Filippi.*

Day 10: Thessaloniki

After breakfast, explore Thessaloniki, the second biggest city in Greece, after Athens! Nestled in the heart of the Thermaic Gulf, Thessaloniki serves as a commercial, business and transportation hub for the northern side of Greece. Founded in 315 BC by Cassander of Macedon, Thessaloniki's history spans over 2,300 years. An important metropolis by the Roman period, it was the second largest and wealthiest city of the Byzantine Empire. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is a home to numerous, notable Byzantine and Paleo Christian monuments. The tour begins with the Arch of Galerius in the lower town. Visit Agios Georgios and Agia Sofia with preserved precious mosaics. The afternoon is at leisure. Enjoy dinner at a traditional restaurant.

Day 11: Thessaloniki – Departure

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight home.

Included:

- Arrival and departure transfers;
- 10 nights at centrally located hotels;
- Daily breakfast, 10 dinners and 1 lunch;
- All entrance fees as per itinerary;
- Transportation by air-conditioned vehicles throughout the tour;
- English speaking local guides in each country – border to border;

Highlights of Lisbon and Porto

8 DAYS

Day 1: Arrival to Lisbon

Arrive in Lisbon and transfer to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 2: Lisbon

After breakfast, depart to the district of Castelo on a convenient TukTuk ride towards the Castle of São Jorge located on the highest hill of Lisbon, one of the most emblematic monuments of the capital. Descend to the old district of Alfama, known for its white houses, labyrinthine streets, inner courtyards and dead ends. After lunch, continue to Belém to see the Belém tower, the Monument to the Discoveries and the Jerónimos Monastery. Visit the National Coach Museum containing one of the most important and rich collections of coaches in the world. Overnight in Lisbon.

Day 3: Lisbon, Sintra, Cascais, Estoril

After breakfast, depart to Sintra, a magnificent UNESCO World Heritage site. Discover the charms and history of the town that enchanted kings and poets. Visit the romantic Pena Palace or Sintra's Royal Palace (subject to availability). If the weather permits, we will stop at the Westernmost point of continental Europe, Cabo da Roca. Enjoy the sea views along the coast on our way to Cascais. After lunch, continue to the gardens of the Casino in Estoril, the place where Ian Fleming got his idea for the James Bond movies. Return to the hotel for an overnight.



Day 4: Lisbon, Évora, Estremoz

After breakfast, depart to Évora, a World Heritage Site that houses a superb monumental complex including the Roman Temple of Diana, the imposing Cathedral, the Church of São Francisco and its mysterious Chapel of Bones. Enjoy wine tasting at a wine estate. After lunch, continue to Estremoz, known as the «white city» due to its white houses, it is also

one of the largest exporters of white marble in the world. Return to the hotel for an overnight.

Day 5: Lisbon, Fátima, Coimbra, Porto

After breakfast, we depart to Fátima, a place of faith and the pilgrimage world center. Continue to Coimbra, the country's former capital, famous for its University, the oldest in Portugal and one of the oldest in Europe, which over time has shaped its image to become «the city of students». After lunch, enjoy a stroll in the oldest part of Coimbra made of narrow and steep streets that lead to the top of the hill. Transfer to your hotel in Porto for a check in and overnight.

Day 6: Porto

After breakfast, enjoy a day tour of Porto, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Visit the 12th century Cathedral and the Church of São Francisco, one of the most remarkable examples of Portuguese Baroque. Continue to Lello Bookstore, the Majestic Café and the magnificent São Bento Station. After lunch, visit the Serralves Park which extends beyond Casa de Serralves across 18 hectares including gardens and a Romantic lake. Finish the day with wine tasting at Port Wine Cellar and a 50-minutes boat trip on the Douro river. Return to the hotel for an overnight.

Day 7: Porto, Viana do Castelo, Braga, Guimarães

After breakfast, depart to the gem of Northern Portugal – Viana do Castelo, a seaside town by the Lima River famous for its craftsmanship. After lunch, continue to Braga, one of the oldest Christian cities in the world. Drive to the city of Guimarães, also known as the birthplace of Portugal; its historic center has been declared World Heritage by

UNESCO. Return to Porto an overnight.

Day 8: Porto – Departure

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight home.

- Arrival and departure transfers;
- 7 nights at centrally located hotels;
- Daily breakfast and 6 lunches;

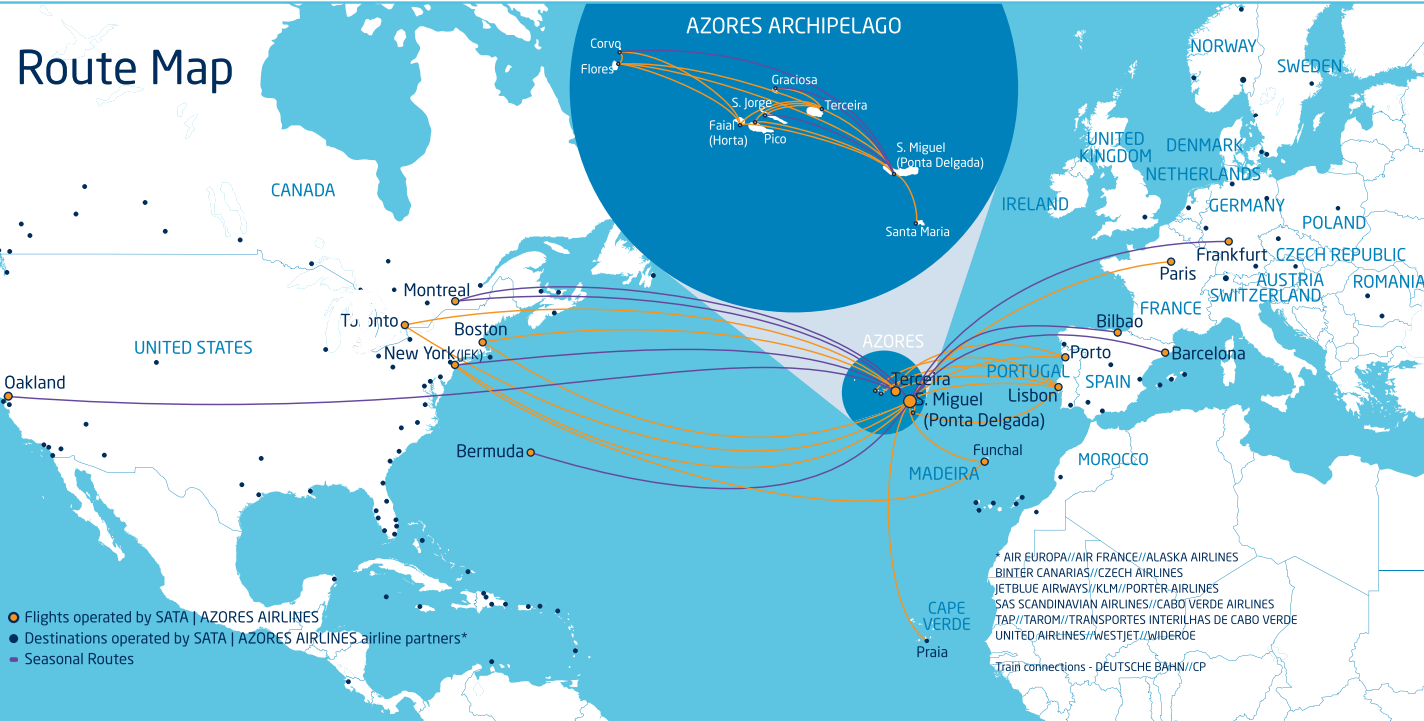

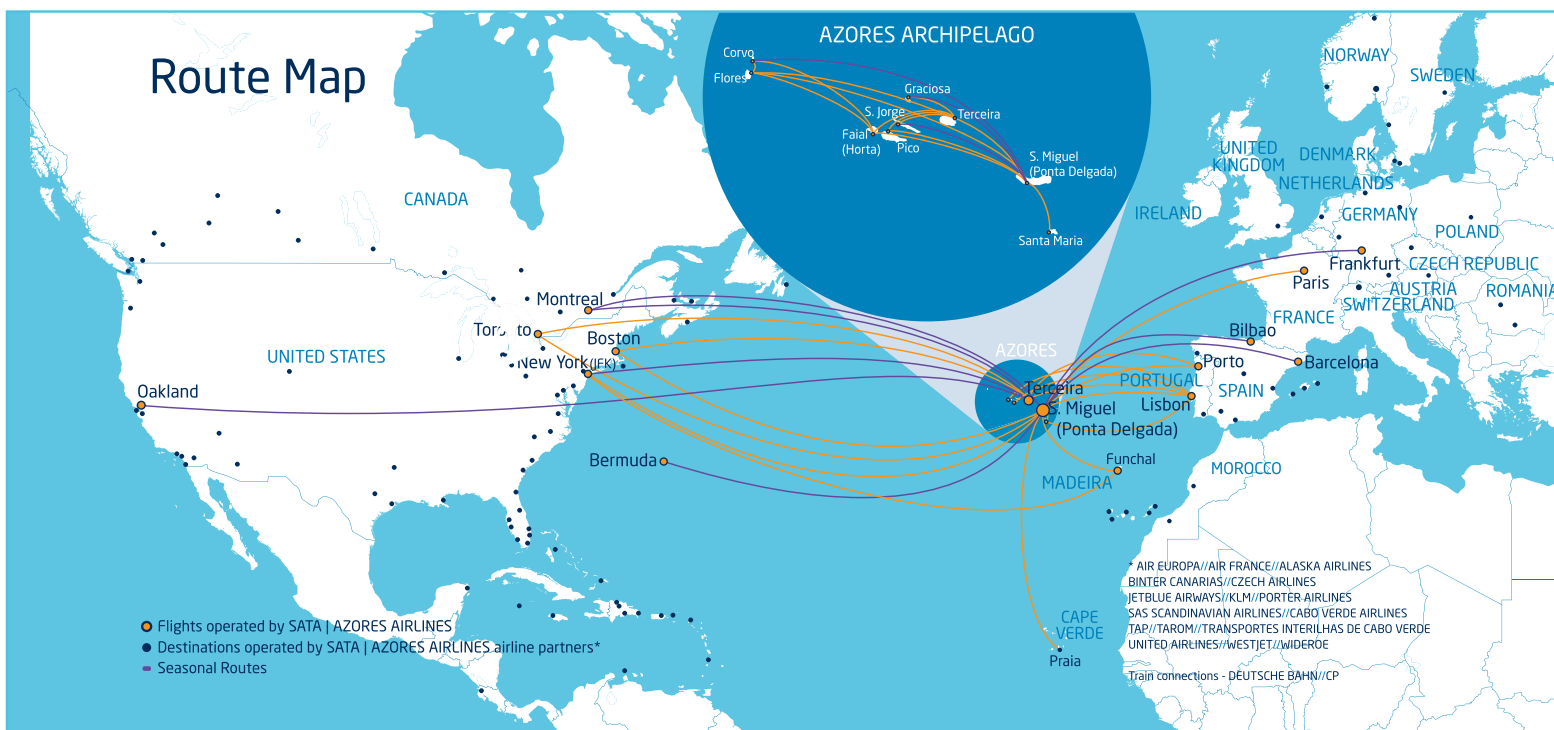

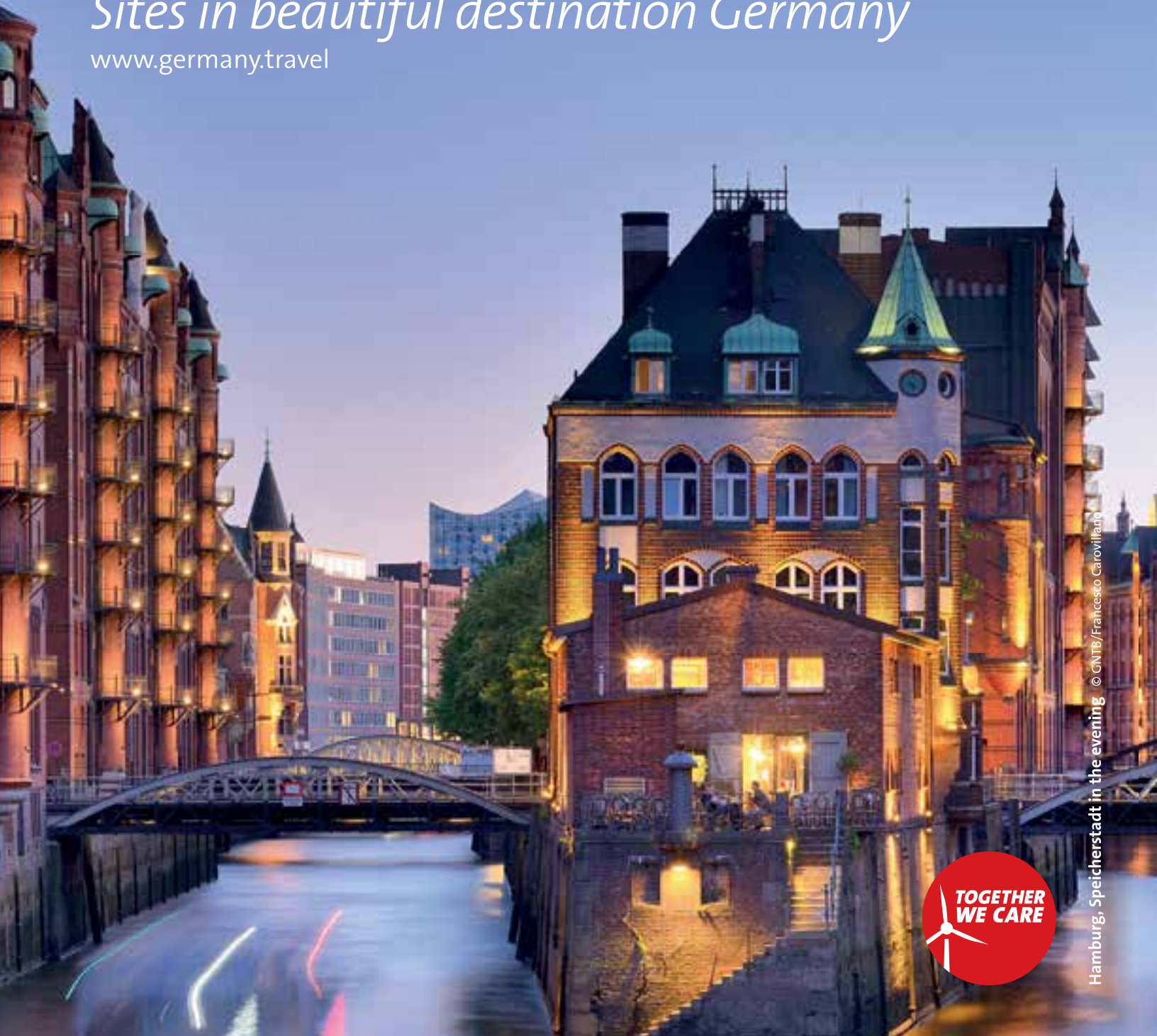

After breakfast, our journey begins with a panoramic sightseeing tour, following the Old Town through its old city gate, known as the Gates of Dawn. Visit the main landmarks, such as Vilnius Cathedral, Gediminas Tower, Peter and Paul Church, St. Anne's Church, and the University – one of the oldest in Northern Europe. In the afternoon you don't want to miss a short trip to Trakai, the medieval capital of Lithuania, where the Fairytale Castle is beautifully located on an island in Lake Galve. In the evening enjoy a folklore dinner at Restaurant Belmontas, built in 1838. Overnight at the hotel in Vilnius.

Day 3: Vilnius, Riga

After breakfast, drive to one of the most poignant landmarks, the Hill of Crosses in northern Lithuania. Catholic pilgrims have carried crosses to the Hill of Crosses for over two centuries. There are estimated to be more than 200,000 crosses of all sizes. The next stop will be made at the



magnificent Baroque Rundale Palace, the former summer residence of the Duke of Courland. The masterpiece was built in the 1730's, and represents a sumptuous display of aristocratic excess. Travel through the Rolling Hills of southern Latvia to Riga. The capital of Latvia on the River Daugava is more than 800 years old and with a blend of a medieval centre and a modern city. Check into your hotel. Enjoy evening at leisure. Overnight at the hotel in Riga.



Day 4: Riga and Surroundings

After breakfast, visit the stunning scenery of the Gauja National Park and the town of Sigulda. Learn about an old Latvian legend of the Rose of Turaida, a young maid who became famous for the tragic way she died at the hands of a spurned admirer. Today newlyweds place flowers at the site. Before your return to Riga, see the ruins of the Episcopal Castle and the Knights of the Sword Castle. Enjoy afternoon at leisure. Overnight at the hotel in Riga.

Optional afternoon program includes a visit of the Ethnographical Open Air Museum, a spacious exposition of 18th century country life. In the evening – optional organ concert at the Dome Cathedral.

Day 5: Riga

After breakfast, explore the Old Town including the Riga Castle, the Dome Cathedral, St. Peter's Church, the Swedish Gate, and «The Three Brothers» – the oldest medieval dwelling houses in Riga. See the Large and the Small Guilds, and the Freedom Monument, honouring soldiers killed during the Latvian War of Independence. In the afternoon visit Jurmala, the vibrant Latvian sea resort, famous for its wooden architecture and sandy beaches. Return to Riga for an excellent diner at the Restaurant Forest. Overnight at the hotel in Riga.

Day 6: Riga, Tallinn

After breakfast, drive to the Estonian summer resort of Parnu where we stop for a short tour. Continue through the North Estonian forests to Tallinn. Check into your hotel. The rest of the day is free to unwind. Overnight at the hotel in Tallinn.

Day 7: Tallinn

After breakfast, explore the Estonian capital of Tallinn. Experience the core of the city with its shops, galleries, souvenir markets, outdoor cafés and restaurants. Your visit of the Old Town, surrounded by medieval city walls, includes to the Toompea Castle, the Dome Church, and the Alexander Nevsky Cathedral, built in typical Russian Revival style, is as

spectacular as onion dome cathedral on the top of Toompea Hill.

See the Old Town Hall – the oldest in the Baltic and Scandinavia region and don't miss the Great Guild Hall for artisans and merchants, dating from the 14th century. In the afternoon visit to Kadriorg Park, the most outstanding palatial and urban park in Estonia. Continue to KUMU, the new award-winning Estonian art museum, housing a collection of classic and contemporary fine art. In the evening gather for a Farewell medieval dinner at the Restaurant Peppersack, known for its delightful menu and great beer, and which is located in the very heart of Tallinn. Overnight is at the hotel in Tallinn.

Day 8: Tallinn – Departure

After breakfast and check out, transfer to the airport.

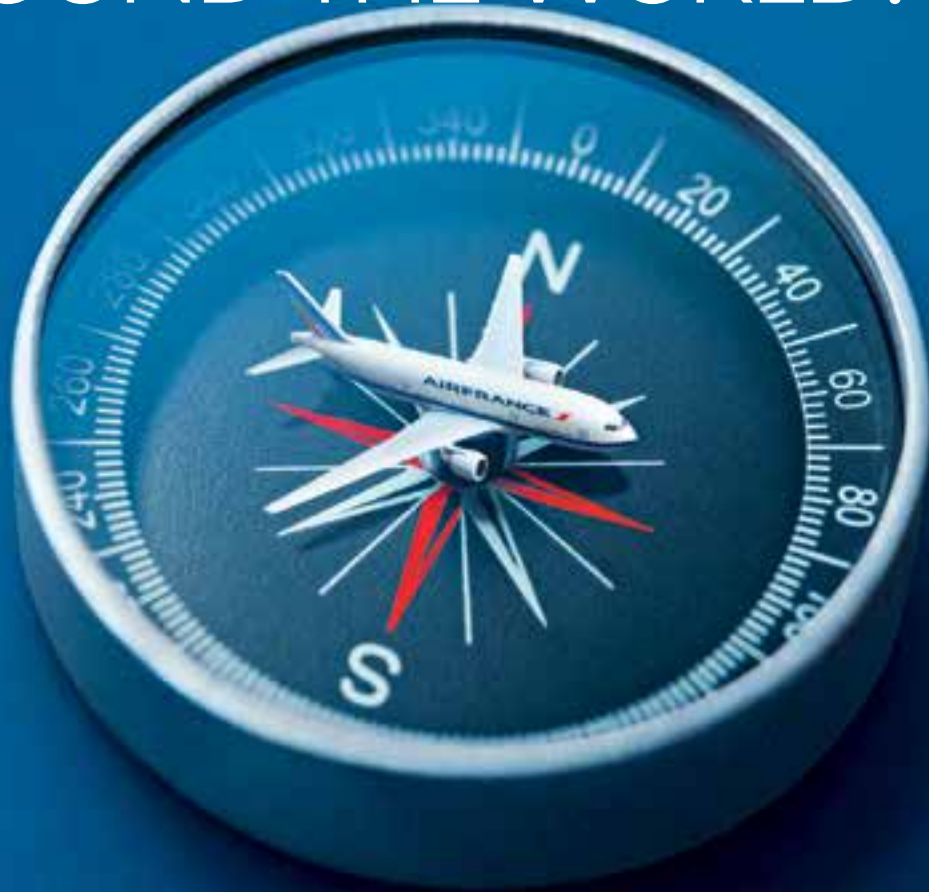

Day 4: Gdansk, Malbork, Torun

After breakfast and check out, depart for Torun with en route visit of the imposing Teutonic Knights' Castle in Malbork, the UNESCO World Heritage Site renewed as an outstanding



example of medieval defensive outpost. Get carried away by its impressive history that can be traced to the days of the Teutonic Knights. Afternoon, arrival in the Medieval Town of Torun and enjoy a sightseeing tour of the UNESCO World Heritage Site. Immerse yourself into the ambiance of the medieval township. Stroll along the small historic trading city that preserves a remarkable scale of its original street pattern and marvelous early buildings. Torun is also famous for being the birthplace of the greatest mathematician and astronomer Nicolaus Copernicus. Overnight at the hotel in Torun.



Day 5: Wroclaw

After breakfast and check out, drive to Wroclaw. Upon arrival, spend the afternoon getting an overview of the city historical sites during your guided tour. Being located on the Odra River with its 12 islands, the place is known as «The city of hundred bridges». Prepare to be amazed at the magnificent age-old architectural facades, Town Hall on the Market Square and beautifully preserved Cathedral Island. Overnight at the hotel in Wroclaw.

Day 6: Jasna Gora Monastery in Czestochowa, Auschwitz, Krakow

After breakfast and check out, drive to Krakow to visit the Jasna Gora Monastery in Czestochowa, housing the third-largest Catholic pilgrimage site in the world, and the famous Black Madonna. Pay homage to the victims of Auschwitz by visiting the former WWII Nazi concentration camp. Overnight at the hotel in Krakow.

Day 7: Krakow

After breakfast, get acquainted with the highlights of the UNESCO World Heritage Sites: the Barbican fortified outpost, the Wawel Castle, St. Florian's Gate, the Krakow Cloth Hall and many others. Explore the well-preserved Old Town area with a Christian quarter in the West and the former largely Jewish quarter in the East. This afternoon visit to the Wieliczka Salt Mine, one of the most valuable monuments of material and spiritual culture in Poland and listed at a UNESCO World Heritage. All of its beautiful chapels have been sculpted in salt. Its spacious chambers and underground ponds are created at an average depth of

250 m below the ground level. Overnight is at the hotel in Krakow.

Day 8: Krakow – Departure

Breakfast at the hotel and check out.

The pedestrian-only, 18th century old town is known for its lively bars and cafes. Perched atop a hill, the reconstructed Bratislava Castle overlooks old town and the Danube River. Continue to Budapest, also known as «Paris of the East». Overnight in Budapest. *Optional: A luxury river cruise.*

Day 5: Budapest

After breakfast, start your city tour with the Heroes' Square, Vajdahunyad Castle and a neo-Renaissance building of the Hungarian State Opera House.



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Continue to the most famous landmark of the city – the Neo-Gothic style Parliament building on the bank of the Danube River. The rest of the day is at leisure. Check out shops along the Vaci Utca Street, or Andrássy, also called the Champs Elysees. Overnight in Budapest. *Optional: Dinner with live music in a typical Hungarian Csarda restaurant.*

Day 6: Budapest

After breakfast, explore the Castle Hill area with its 13th century Matthias Church, the heart of Buda's district, and Fisherman's Bastion. After breakfast drive around the main streets of Tel Aviv, the center of business and entertainment in Israel. Known as the «White City», Tel Aviv was declared as a UNESCO world cultural heritage site for its collection of over 4,000 Bauhaus style buildings. Stop at Rabin Square, the site of assassination of Prime Minister Itzhak Rabin in 1995. Continue to Old Yafo, one of the oldest port cities in the world; visit the Flea Market and ancient ruins and walk along the Artists Quarter. Visit Neve Tzedek, the first neighborhood of Tel Aviv built in 1887. Transfer to your hotel.

Day 3: Caesarea, Megiddo, Druze village, Haifa

After breakfast, drive along the coastal plain to Caesarea, once the Roman capital of the region; see the excavations of the Crusader-era city, the Roman port, aqueduct, and the amphitheater that has been restored to its former glory as a concert venue. Proceed to Megiddo, identified as the site of Armageddon; visit the archaeological excavations including the well-preserved water supply system. Continue to Daliat el-Carmel, a Druze village and enjoy a late lunch at a local restaurant. Proceed via Mount Carmel to Haifa for a panoramic view of Haifa Bay and the Golden domed Bahai Shrine and Gardens. Return to Tel Aviv for overnight.

Day 4: Safed, Katzrin, Golan winery

After breakfast, drive to Safed, the center of Jewish mysticism. Visit the ancient synagogues and the Artist Quarter. Continue to the Golan Heights to see the former Syrian bunkers, Quneitra and the new Israeli town of Katzrin. Stop at the Golan Heights Winery for a tour and wine

tasting. Visit to Nazareth; visit the Church of Annunciation. Visit Capernaum to see the ruins of the synagogue and octagonal Church of St. Peter, Mount of Beatitudes where Jesus delivered the Sermon on the Mount. Drive, via Beit Shean and Cana, to Sindyanna and enjoy an Olive Oil tasting. Return to Tel Aviv for overnight.

Day 5: Jerusalem

After breakfast, transfer to Jerusalem and check into your hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure.

Day 6: Israel Museum, Old City, Bethlehem

After breakfast depart to visit the Israel Museum and the Shrine of the Book, where the Dead Sea scrolls are housed. See the miniature model of Jerusalem as it was during the Second Temple period. Proceed to enter the walled city and walk through the newly restored Jewish Quarter. Visit the Roman Cardo, the Herodian Quarter and continue to the Western Wall. Walk along the Via Dolorosa to the Church of Holy Sepulchre. Continue to Bethlehem and visit the Church of Nativity and Manger's Square. Walk along the



famous and colorful market of Machne Yehuda and enjoy bites of the local food.

Day 7: Qumran, Masada, Dead Sea

Drive through the Judean Desert to the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth at almost 1300 feet (400 meters) below sea level. Stop at Qumran to visit the site where the Dead Sea scrolls were found. Drive along the shores of the Dead Sea to Masada. Ascend by cable car and tour the ancient fortress where the Zealots made their last stand against the Romans before committing mass suicide in 73 AD. Descend by cable car. Continue to the Dead Sea; cover yourself with the mineral rich mud and experience a swim in the Dead Sea that many believe offers therapeutic effects.

Day 8: Jerusalem, Allenby, Madaba, Mt. Nebo, Petra

After breakfast, drive from Jerusalem to the Sheikh Hussein border crossing for procedures to enter Jordan. After crossing the border, drive to Mount Nebo to the point where Moses looked across the promised Land. Explore town of Madaba and discover the amazing Byzantine mosaics including «Madaba Map», the oldest preserved mosaic map of the Holy Lands. Transfer to Petra via Wadi AL Mujib. Enjoy the Petra Night Show, where you will see part of the rock city lit by over 1500 candles and explore the old city.

Day 9: Petra, Little Petra, Wadi Rum

After breakfast, drive to the «Lost City», the Red Rose City of Petra, exploring its many caves and tombs. Walk through the canyon and be astounded at the magnificent Treasury, now one of the Modern 7 Wonders of the World. Continue to Siq Al Barid (Cold Canyon), also known as Little Petra. Drive to the desert of Wadi Rum, enjoy the sunset and gaze at the stars while enjoying the legendary hospitality of the Bedouin.

Dinner and overnight in Wadi Rum.

Day 10: Jeep Safari, Amman

After breakfast, enjoy the wilderness adventure of a 4x4 jeep tour of Wadi Rum, following in the footsteps of Lawrence of Arabia, climbing sand dunes and rock bridges. Then drive to Amman and enjoy a tour of the old city of Amman exploring the Citadel and the Roman Theatre, two of the most popular archaeological sites in the city.

Day 11: Amman, Jerash, Ajloun

After breakfast, visit Ajloun Castle followed by the ancient Greco-Roman city of Jerash, including the paved and colonnaded streets, soaring hilltop temples, theatres, spacious public squares and plazas, baths, fountains and the city walls. Farewell dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 12: Amman – Departure

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your international flight back home.

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14 DAYS

The south Caucasus comprises three unique, yet interconnected countries: Georgia, Armenia, and Azerbaijan. The history of Orthodox Christian Georgia, Gregorian Christian Armenia and Muslim Azerbaijan is a blend through centuries of friendship and battle for survival. Still each country is unique with its own distinct customs, traditions and religion. The Caucasus area boasts the flourishing culture with impressive architectural monuments, archaeological pagan excavations, spread out monastic shelters, ancient mosques, wonders of nature, and of course centuries-old cities.

Day 1: Arrival to Baku, Azerbaijan

Transfer from the airport to your hotel for check in. Overnight in Baku.

Day 2: Baku Old City and Absheron Peninsula Tour

After breakfast, visit the historical core of Baku, the Old City, also known as Inner City. For about thousand years a vivid stream of traffic – farmers driving bull-carts, cavalcades of horsemen, camels, caravans and occasional pilgrims – poured across the drawbridge over the moat and through the iron-cased double gates. Having served as a fortress throughout centuries, the Old City still remains the remnants of its massive walls. Walk along a maze of narrow alleys, see Shirvanshah's Palace – one of the pearls of Azerbaijan's architecture and UNESCO World Heritage Site. View the Maiden Tower, Ateshgah, often called the «Fire Temple of Baku» and visit the Carpet Museum as carpets have been woven in Azerbaijan from time immemorial. In the afternoon

explore the Absheron Peninsula, an extension of the Caucasus Mountains, just 35 miles into the Caspian Sea, the largest inland sea in the world. Vineyards and tea plantations can be found here, but the region is particularly known for its oil deposits. Visit the Burning Mountain Yanar Dag, the quadrangular Mardakan Castle and Ramana Castle, dated back to the 12th century. Overnight at the hotel in Baku.

Day 3: Baku, Gobustan, Shamakhi, Sheki

After breakfast, visit a UNESCO World Heritage Site – the Gobustan National Park. It has an outstanding universal value for the quality and density of its rock engravings. The substantial collection of rock art images depicts human activity and lifestyle in prehistoric times and reflects the cultural continuity between ancient and mediaeval times. Visit Diri Baba Mausoleum, one of the most impressive tombs ever built in Azerbaijan.

Next stop is an ancient Azerbaijan city, Shamakhi. Its history begins in the 5th century BC, later on it becomes a capital of the Shirvan Empire and a residence of Shirvan Dynasty, when it was considered one of the most beautiful cities of the Orient. In the middle of 18th century it used to be the center of Shamakhi Khanate.

Today Shamakhi is famed for its winemaking and carpet weaving. In the late afternoon we proceed to Sheki, a small city, set in the forested slopes of the Greater Caucasus Mountains among of the picturesque mountain area rich in narrow gorges and green valleys, springs, purest rivers, waterfalls and mineral water springs framed by dense woods and alpine meadows. Overnight at the hotel in Sheki.



Day 4: Sheki, Lagodekhi Border, Tbilisi

After breakfast, enjoy your sightseeing tour of Sheki. One of the major historical sites in Azerbaijan is the Sheki Khan's Palace built in late 18th century as a summer palace. It features decorative tiles, fountains and several stained-glass windows. The basic material for the Palace construction was raw bricks, river stones, plane trees and oaks.

The most amazing feature is has is that been assembled as a puzzle, not a single nail or glue drop was used for the construction! Nearby the Khans Palace, we will have a chance to meet the people who still continue this family tradition of making stained-glass windows and witness work in process. As Sheki was one of the cities on the legendary Silk Road, don't miss the Upper and Lower Caravanserais which were built in 18th century with a view of convenience and safety to the merchants and their goods. After lunch continue to the Lagodekhi border, and then drive to Tbilisi, the capital of Georgia. Overnight at the hotel in Tbilisi.

Day 5: Tbilisi

After breakfast, enjoy Tbilisi, the city that has been dominated by traders, warriors, artisans and dictators in turn. Take a walk around the old town and breathe in the living past. Today Tbilisi is a modern city with a well-established infrastructure, museums and theatres, art galleries, churches and archaeological excavations, narrow streets with inner courts, surrounded with balconies decorated with flowers. Yours sightseeing tour includes the Old City and the Metekhi Church, the place where the first church built, when Tbilisi became a capital in the 5th century. Continue to the Narikala Fortress, also called the Mother Fortress of Tbilisi, as Narikala

is an ancient symbol of Tbilisi's defence. Abanotubani district is known for its famous Sulphur baths, see Sioni Cathedral, Anchiskhati Basilica, and walk along the main city's artery Rustaveli Avenue. Afternoon can be offered optional tours to the National Museum of Georgia or Open Air Ethnographic Museum. Enjoy real Georgian hospitality and cuisine at dinner at one of the local restaurant. Overnight at the hotel in Tbilisi.

Day 6: Round trip to Wine Region – Kakheti

After breakfast, explore a picturesque and the most fertile part of Georgia – Kakheti, which borders the Great Caucasus Range from the north Alazani Valley, summits of which are over 3,000 m. This region is known as a birthplace of viticulture and winemaking. The reach land, burning sun and hard work have developed about 500 varieties of vine in Georgia.

After lunch and wine tasting arranged at a local winery, visit the Bodbe Nunnery, the Georgian Orthodox monastic complex. Enjoy breathtaking views of Kizikhi area and delightful charm of Signaghi Royal Town, the tourist local highlight. Stroll along narrow streets of the town in shadow of wooden balconies richly decorated with the lace of carved ornaments.

On the return way don't miss the Tsinandali Family Estate. View the palace and gardens created by Prince Alexander Chavchavadze and learn about the family, who played a significant part in the national history. Overnight at the hotel in Tbilisi.



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Day 7: From Tbilisi to Khevi Province

After breakfast, drive to Mtskheta – the ancient capital of Georgia, located at the confluence of the Aragvi and Mtkvari Rivers. Visit UNESCO World Heritage Sites: Jvari, the 6th century cross-shaped monastery built on the top of a cliff, overlooking the confluence of the Aragvi and Mtkvari Rivers where St. Nino, a female Evangelist, erected a large wooden cross on the site of a pagan temple.

Another holy site to visit is Svetitskhoveli, the fortified cathedral dating from the 11th century, where the Robe of Christ is said to have been buried. Drive along Georgian Military Highway and visit Ananuri architectural complex, former residence of Dukes of Aragvi region. Complex featuring churches and towers dating back to the 16th–17th centuries is beautifully overlooking Jinvali reservoir. Arrive in Gudauri for a dinner and overnight.

Day 8: Greater Caucasus Mountains

After breakfast, explore Kazbegi – a small town with views of Mount Kazbek – the seventh highest peak in the Caucasus Mountains. Mount Kazbek is associated with myth of Prometheus, according to the legend he was chained on the mountain in punishment for having stolen fire from the gods and having given it to mortals. Hike up approximately 3 hours to the 14th century Gergeti Holy Trinity Church located at an elevation of 2170 m under Mt. Kazbek. (4WD vehicles are available to drive to the church on supplementary basis). Overnight at the hotel in Gudauri.

Day 9: Gudauri, Gori, Uplistsikhe, Borjomi, Akhaltsikhe

After breakfast, drive to the center of Shida Kartli region – Gori, known as the birthplace of the Soviet leader Joseph Stalin where you will visit Stalin's Museum and see the house, where Stalin was born. Visit the rock-hewn town Uplistsikhe, also known as «Fortress of God», which is identified by archaeologists as one of the oldest urban settlements in Georgia. It is outstanding for its unique combination of various styles of rock-cut cultures and the co-existence of pagan and Christian architecture. On your way to Akhaltsikhe we travel via the resort town Borjomi and make a short stop to visit beautiful the Borjomi Park, and to taste Borjomi mineral water. Overnight at the hotel in Akhaltsikhe.

Day 10: Akhaltsikhe, Vardzia, Yerevan

After breakfast, explore Samtskhe – Javakheti region is known by its numerous fortresses, churches and some of the oldest settlements, dry landscapes and healthy climate, cool water springs and steppe vegetation. The highlight of the day is visit to the rock-cut town Vardzia, built in the 12-13th centuries by Queen Tamar. Initially it was planned as a town-fortress, but later on the complex turned to a well defended monastery and important political, cultural, educational and spiritual center of the country. After lunch we make a photo stop at Khertvisi Fortress and proceed to Georgia – Armenian border. Once completing border formalities continue tour into Armenia. Overnight in Yerevan.

Day 11: Yerevan, Echmiadzin, Yerevan

After breakfast, drive to Echmiadzin, the religious center of the Armenian Apostolic Church. Its grandeur and beauty astonishes at first sight and leaves a deep impression in the hearts of people witnessing it. Echmiadzin Cathedral is designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. On your return to Yerevan visit the Matenadaran – Institute of Ancient Manuscripts, one of the richest book-depositories in the world. Its collection of about 17000 manuscripts includes almost all the areas of ancient and medieval Armenian culture and sciences as well as manuscripts in Arabic, Persian, Greek, Syrian, Latin, Ethiopian, Indian, Japanese and others. Since 1998 Matenadaran was included in the register of the UNESCO's «Memory of the World» Programme. Visit to Tsitsernakaberd – the memorial complex dedicated to the victims of the Great Armenian Genocide committed by Ottoman Turks in 1915. The 44 meter stele with an eternal flame symbolizes the national rebirth of Armenians. Overnight at the hotel in Yerevan.

Day 12: Yerevan, Garni, Geghard, Khor Virap, Yerevan

After breakfast, visit Garni – a Hellenistic temple built in the 1st century AD which served as a summer residence for Armenian kings. It is the only pagan temple on the territory of modern Armenia, others were destroyed after the adoption of Christianity.

Tour Geghard – a medieval monastery, being partially carved out of the adjacent mountain, surrounded by cliffs, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. After lunch en route visit another ancient monastery, Khor Virap – one of the holiest sites in Armenia, where Gregory the Illuminator was imprisoned in the underground pit before converting King Tiridat III to Christianity. This site, near the closest point to Mount Ararat within Armenian borders, offers a stunning view of the mountain, the national symbol of Armenia. Overnight at the hotel in Yerevan.

Day 13: Yerevan, Sevan, Alaverdi, Tbilisi

After breakfast, drive to Lake Sevan (located at 60 km from Yerevan) – the largest body of water in Armenia and the Caucasus region, and one of the largest freshwater high-altitude lakes in Eurasia. Its surface reaches an altitude of 1,950 m above sea level. Along with Lake Van and Lake Urmia, Sevan was one of the three great lakes of the Armenian Kingdom, referred to as the seas of Armenia, and it is the only one within today's Republic of Armenia. Armenians called it «The Blue Pearl». This fresh water lake of volcanic origin is like a mirror, reflecting the sky and changing color several times a day. Before leaving Armenia, visit two monasteries en route the Alaverdi Monastery and the Haghpat Monastery. Drive to the Georgian Border at Sadakhlo and continue your trip to Tbilisi. Overnight at the hotel in Tbilisi.

Day 14: Tbilisi – Departure

After breakfast and check out, transfer to the airport.

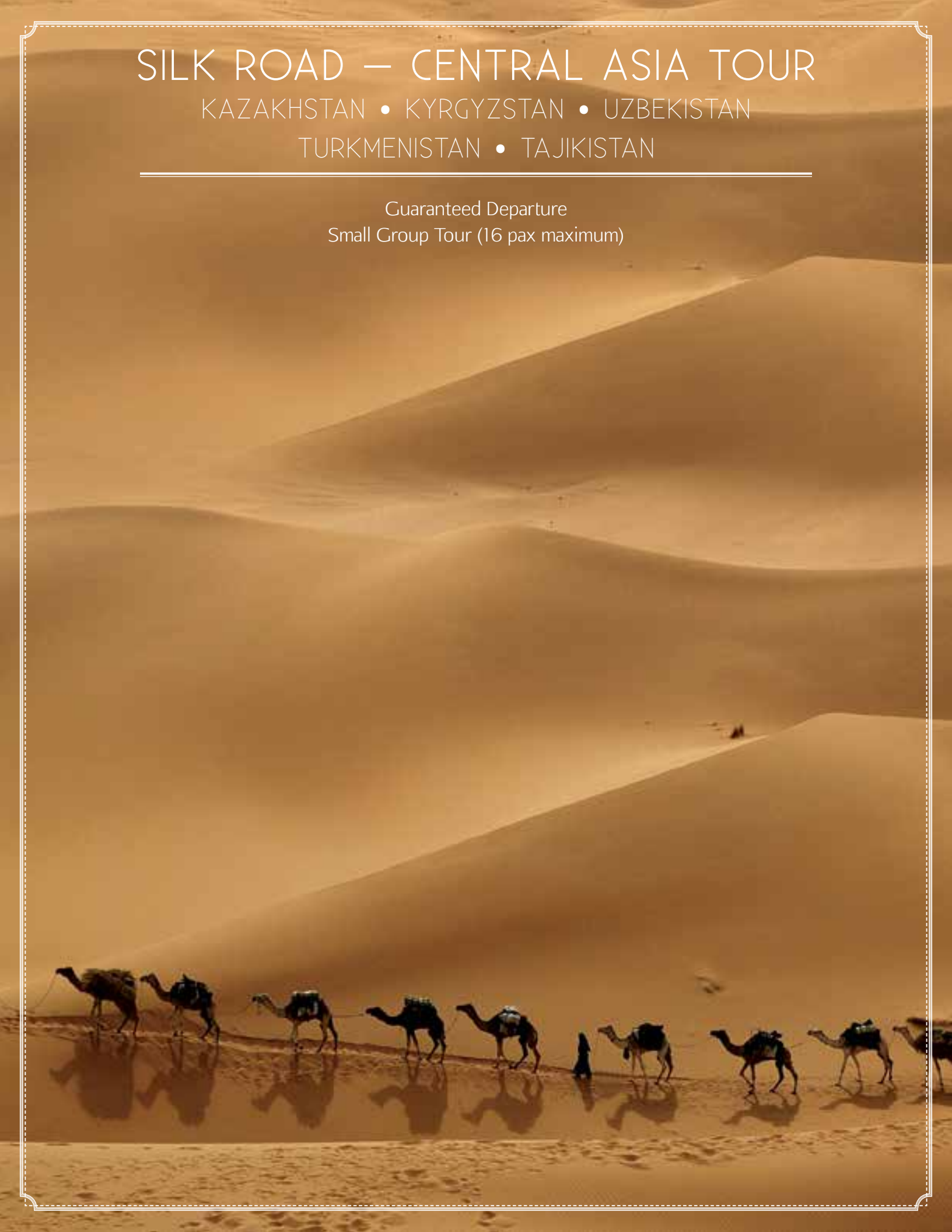

Day 1: Arrival to Almaty

Arrive in Almaty and transfer to your hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure. Overnight in Almaty.

Day 2: Almaty

After breakfast, enjoy a sightseeing tour of Almaty including Panfilov Park, Zenkov Cathedral, Republic Square and the Central State Kazakhstan Museum. Enjoy a panoramic view of the city from the top of Kok-Tobe Hill followed by Medeo Gorge, a picturesque valley located 15 km above Almaty. Welcome lunch. The rest of the day is at leisure. Overnight in Almaty.

Day 3: Almaty, Bishkek

After breakfast, drive to Bishkek for about 4 hours. After crossing Kazakhstan – Kyrgyzstan border, arrive in Bishkek and check into your hotel. In the late afternoon start a sightseeing tour including Oak Park, Ala Too Square, Statue

of Manas, National Museum of Fine Arts, Philharmonic Hall and Victory Monument. Overnight in Bishkek.

Day 4: Bishkek, Burana, Don Aryk, Bishkek, Tashkent

After breakfast and check out, drive to Burana Tower, a historical complex that marks the original site of Balasagun, a Karakhanid town. Continue to Kyrgyz national horse game «Ulak Tartysh» (goat pulling). After lunch at a local Kyrgyz family house, transfer to Don Aryk village (70 km). Watch a demonstration of yurt building (nomadic dwelling). Transfer back to Bishkek airport (110 km) for your evening flight to Tashkent. Arrive in Tashkent and transfer to your hotel. Overnight in Tashkent.

Day 5: Tashkent, Urgench, Khiva

After breakfast, start your city tour from an Old City part of Tashkent – Khast-Imam Complex and Chorsu Bazaar – the heart of every oriental place. Continue through Amir Timur Square, Independence Square and explore the Applied Arts





Museum. Enjoy free time before transferring to a domestic airport for your evening flight to Urgench. Arrive in Urgench and transfer to your hotel in Khiva. Overnight in Khiva.

Day 6: Khiva

After breakfast, start a guided walking tour with the Ichan-Kala Fortress, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Visit educational and religious institutions such as Mukhammad Amin Khan Madrasah, Mukhammad Rahimkhan Madrasah, Kalta Minor, Kunya-Ark, Juma Mosque, Tosh-Khovli Palace, Pakhlavan Makhmud Mausoleum and Minaret of Islom-Khoja. The rest of the day is at leisure. Overnight in Khiva.

Day 7: Khiva, Kunya-Urgench, Darvaza Gas Crater

After breakfast, drive to Uzbekistan – Turkmenistan border point Shavat-Dashoguz. After crossing the border, meet your Turkmenistan guide and drive to Kunya Urgench. Visit



mausoleums of Turebek-Khanym, Sultan Tekesh, Sultan II Arslan, Najmad-din-Kubra, Sultan Ali. Discover the Kutlug Timur Minaret and Kyrk Molla hill. In the afternoon, drive to Darvaza Gas Crater located in the middle of the Karakum Desert for about 4 hours. Set up a camp (tents and necessary equipment will be provided). Enjoy a delicious fire-cooked dinner near a burning gas crater. Overnight in tents. *Note: the trip to Darvaza Gas Crater and an overnight in tents can be replaced with a flight from Dashoguz to Ashgabat at an additional price. Overnight in tents in Darvaza Gas Crater. Optional: overnight in a hotel in Ashgabat.*

Day 8: Darvaza Gas Crater, Ashgabat

After a camp-style breakfast, depart to Ashgabat (3h 30 min). On the way stop by Erbent village to witness life of locals surrounded by desert. After arrival in Ashgabat, enjoy a sightseeing tour of the beautiful capital of Turkmenistan. Explore an archaeological site of Old Nissa, a UNESCO World Heritage site, and the Spiritual Mosque, one of the biggest mosques in Central Asia. Continue to the National Carpet Museum, the Monument of Neutrality, Presidential Square, Ertugrul Gazy Mosque and newly built Independence Park. Overnight in Ashgabat.

Day 9: Ashgabat, Mary, Merv, Bukhara

After breakfast and check out, transfer to the airport for your morning flight to Mary, an ancient city that was a major center of international trade and crafts located on the Silk Road. Discover the historical park with Sultan Sanjar Mausoleum and silhouettes of hills-fortresses: Large and Small Gyz Gala, Erk Gala, Cyaur Gala, Keshk Fortress and others. In the afternoon, drive to Turkmenistan-Uzbekistan border point «Farap-Alat» for about 5 h 30 min. After crossing the border, meet your driver and continue to Bukhara. Arrive in Bukhara and transfer to your hotel. Overnight in Bukhara.

Day 10: Bukhara

After breakfast, start a guided walking tour in the Old City including Lyabi-Khauz Ensemble, Magoki-Attori Mosque, Chor-Minor Madrasah, trade domes, Kalyan Minaret, Kalyan Mosque and Miri-Arab Madrasah. Continue to Ulugbek and Abdulazizkhan madrasahs, Ark Fortress – the symbol of the state power, Bolo-Khauz Mosque, Ismail Samani and Chashma-Ayub mausoleums. Enjoy a national show at Nadir Divan-begi Madrasah. Overnight in Bukhara.

Day 11: Bukhara, Samarkand

After breakfast, drive to Sitorai Mokhi-Khosa – the summer residence of Bukhara's last emir, including the Mausoleum of Bakhouddin Naqshbandi. Transfer to the railway station to take the high-speed Afrosiyob train to Samarkand. Arrive in Samarkand and transfer to you hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure. Overnight in Samarkand.

Day 12: Samarkand, Penjikent, Samarkand

After breakfast, transfer to Uzbekistan – Tajikistan border Jartepa. After crossing the border, meet Tajik local guide and driver to the Seven Lakes, located in the west of the Fann Mountains, ranging in color from calming turquoise to mesmerizing purple. Enjoy a picnic at the last lake of Khozorchashma.

After lunch drive to Penjikent, a major Sogdian city in the 5th century destroyed by Arab conquerors in the 8th century. City's highlights include Rudaki Museum, local Bazaar and mosque. In the suburbs of modern Penjikent, visit a medieval citadel with its picturesque and colorful wall paintings. Late in



the afternoon return to the Jartepa border. After crossing the border, meet your driver and transfer to your hotel in Samarkand. Overnight in Samarkand.

Day 13: Samarkand

After breakfast, start a city tour including spectacular Registan Square, Gur Emir Mausoleum – the resting place of Amir Timur, remains of Bibi Khanum Mosque, Siab Bazaar and Ulugbek Observatory, the unique construction built up in 1428-1429. Continue to the village of Konigil located near Samarkand to explore a traditional way of making Samarkand paper from mulberry trees. Overnight in Samarkand.

Day 14: Samarkand, Tashkent

After breakfast, explore more of city's highlights: Shakhi-Zinda Necropolis, Afrasiab Museum and the Tomb of Saint Daniel. After free time for shopping and lunch, transfer to the railway station. Take the high-speed Afrosiyob train to Tashkent. Arrive in Tashkent and transfer to you hotel followed by a Farewell dinner. Overnight in Tashkent.

Day 1: Arrival to Istanbul

Overnight in Cappadocia.





Day 7: Cappadocia, Pamukkale

After breakfast and check out, depart for Konya city, the capital of the Seljuk Turks, to see the Caravanserai of Sultanhanı. After lunch in Konya, continue to the Monastery of the Whirling Dervishes followed by Mevlana Museum to see the shrine of Mevlana Celaleddin Rumi, the founder of the monastic order. His poetry is celebrated worldwide for its beauty and deep spirituality. His tomb has been converted into a museum which houses relics that belonged to him and his disciples. Drive to Pamukkale. Check into your hotel followed by dinner. Overnight at a SPA hotel in Pamukkale.

Day 8: Pamukkale, Kusadasi

After breakfast, visit the famous Pamukkale, also known as the «Cotton Castle», the dazzling formation of white calcium cascades formed by mineral springs and the ruins of Roman health spa of Hierapolis. Drive through ancient sites of Ephesus, which used to be an ancient Greek city built in the 10th century BC by Attic and Ionian Greek colonists. Discover the Library of Celsus, the Odeon, the Hadrian Temple and Fountain of Trajan. After lunch, visit the House of St. Mary. Check into your hotel followed by dinner. Overnight in Kusadasi.

After wineries, continues to Izmir, the third-largest city in Turkey. Discover its landmarks including spacious Konak Square, the spiritual heart of the city, Kordon and the house on Konak Pier built by Gustave Eiffel and restored as a chic shopping center. Farewell dinner. Overnight in Izmir.

Day 10: Izmir — Departure

After breakfast and check out, transfer to the airport. Departure.

Failure to provide valid documentation may result in denied boarding of the aircraft and cancellation of your travel arrangements without refund. Some countries require that the passport be valid at least six months after the conclusion of your trip. CG Journeys may assist you in obtaining the required entry tourist visa.

CG Journeys is not responsible for any costs incurred by a passenger who is prohibited from entering a country scheduled to be visited on a trip, or a country to which a passenger may be diverted.

Baggage: CG Journeys strongly recommends that you consult the air carrier/or your travel agent as size and weight limitations vary from airline to airline, and destination by destination. Some airlines are now charging for luggage; please consult your carrier or travel agent.

Responsibility of CG Journeys and Others: CG Journeys makes arrangements with reputable suppliers (the «Suppliers») who provide travel and other services (the «Services»).

CG Journeys only acts as an agent for the Suppliers in the arrangement of the Services. CG Journeys cannot exercise control over the personnel, equipment, operations or goods of the Suppliers, and neither it nor its employees, contractors, officers, directors, agents or other representatives (cumulatively, the «Beneficiaries») shall be responsible for the acts of omissions of the Suppliers or those for whom they are in law responsible. The Services provided are subject to specific terms and conditions of these Suppliers and limited by their own rates and agreements or by customs or practices of their business. Passengers ought to refer to the website or other information resources of the Supplier(s) of the Services being purchased. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, neither CG Journeys nor the Beneficiaries shall be responsible for claims, losses, damages, costs or expenses arising directly or indirectly from:

- the acts or omission of any party (-ies) other than CG Journeys or its employees or others.
- failure by passengers to have proper and valid documentation.
- aircraft delays, Government actions, act(s) of God or any factor beyond the direct control of CG Journeys.
- cancellation or delay to any tour or change of itinerary. In case of tour cancellation, liability is limited to the refund of all monies received by CG Journeys.
- printing or typographical errors, or errors arising from unforeseen circumstances.

CG Journeys reserves the right to decline any passenger as a member of these tours at any time.

Form of payment: Subject to the applicable Cancellation Policies (below), a non refundable deposit for each passenger is payable to CG Journeys at the time of booking, to help to secure a reservation. Generally, each passenger must pay to CG Journeys a non-refundable deposit per chart below.

Any possible exception will be specified at the time of booking and on the invoice. Payment of the deposit means you have read and accepted these Terms and Conditions. Payment of the deposit does not oblige CG Journeys to accept a booking; it is confirmed only upon written notification to the passenger by CG Journeys.

Cancellation: To be effective, any cancellation must be in writing and received by CG Journeys. The date of such receipt will govern the amount of the cancellation penalty.

General Cancellation policy:

Tours

* Less than 45 days before departure – 100% of the total cost of the trip

Cruises

* Cancellation 75 days or more before embarkation – 15% of cruise price

* 74-70 days before embarkation – 25% of cruise price

* 69-60 days before embarkation – 50% of cruise price

* 59-41 days before embarkation – 75% of cruise price

* Less than 41 days before embarkation – 100% of cruise price

Rail Journeys by Private Train

* 91+ days of tour departure date - Loss of deposit paid or due

* Within 90 days of tour departure date - 100% of the total cost of the trip

All of the above cancellation penalties may change at any time and are confirmed at time of booking.

Itinerary change: CG Journeys reserves the right to amend any tour itinerary due to force majeure, change in local conditions, or any other reason that CG Journeys may determine.

Although every effort will be made to keep itineraries and hotels as they are shown in the brochure, the Suppliers and CG Journeys each reserve the right to substitute itineraries, features, hotels and other Suppliers due to conditions beyond their control. If a change occurs, every effort will be made to ensure that the locations visited, the excursions taken and the hotels offered are similar to the ones originally planned. Subject to any applicable legislation, any change to itineraries will not result in eligibility for a refund.

Cancellation of Services:

CG Journeys reserves the right to cancel a tour if not enough participants are registered. In the event that certain services are cancelled, CG Journeys will have no responsibility beyond the refund of all monies received by CG Journeys for such cancelled services.

Hotels: Rooms with private facilities in Standard class hotels – unless stated otherwise in writing by CG Journeys, which reserves the right to substitute hotels for a similar category, should this become necessary due to circumstances beyond its control. Hotel reservations of less than 3 nights may be subject to a booking fee, the amount of which will be confirmed at or before the time of booking. Terms and conditions for hotel reservations will be specified on the invoice for each file. Hotel rooms are not guaranteed before 3 pm check in time. Check out time is 12 noon. Hotels reserve the right to increase rates for special international events and trade shows/conferences.

Accommodation on train: Advance reservations for trains are strongly recommended. Reservations for Trans-Siberian itineraries should be made no later than 45 days prior to departure. 1st class train service is defined as accommodation for 2 persons traveling together in one compartment. 2nd class train service is defined as accommodation for 4 persons traveling in one compartment. Train reservations are totally non-refundable and require passport information at the time of booking.

Private Trains: It is a condition of your booking that each passenger has current and valid Travel Insurance as notified at the time of booking. CG Journeys reserves the right to decline to accept a booking if adequate proof of such current and valid Travel Insurance (at its sole discretion) is not provided upon request.

Credit cards: The authorization to CG Journeys and/or to a travel agent to use a credit card number for deposit and/or final payment indicates complete understanding of and compliance with all Terms & Conditions, whether or not the appropriate forms/documents have been signed. Verbal authorization of credit card use can be relied upon by CG Journeys. A letter of confirmation signed by a credit card holder must be kept on file by the travel agency authorizing the use of the credit card without a signature. In the event that a cardholder refuses to honor a charge, the travel agency may be held responsible. A client paying for the trip with the credit card of the third party must provide written confirmation of the cardholder's consent. Credit card payments are subject to a 3.5 – 4 % fee.

Refunds and claims: Subject to any applicable legislation, there is no refund for unused transportation or land portion including voluntary modifications made by the tour participant, or if portions of tour area are missed. In the event that certain services are canceled, the tour operator will have no responsibility beyond the refund of all monies received by CG Journeys or the Supplier in relation to that service, which refund will be deemed to constitute full settlement. Changes to flight itineraries, name and date changes may result in penalties charged by the airline or ground supplier concerned, and passed on to the passenger. The passenger agrees that any claims shall be made by the tour participant in writing, and received by CG Journeys within fifteen (15) days of the return to the point of origin of such passenger.

Special requests: Unless confirmed in writing, special requests – such as room location, bed types, special meals etc. – cannot be guaranteed by CG Journeys. Passengers must advise CG Journeys and/or the relevant Supplier in writing of all relevant allergies or other dietary restrictions, or mobility issues. CG Journeys may be able to assist, if advised in a timely manner. There may be additional costs associated with the accommodation of these requests.

Photographs: Photographs and other depictions, in any brochure or other promotional piece, of destinations, hotels and other elements of the Services may not be actual or currently accurate representations of the Services being purchased.

Legal: Each tour participant agrees that any dispute regarding the Services or these Terms and Conditions shall be governed by the laws of the Province of Ontario, and the laws of Canada applicable therein. Each tour participant attorns to the jurisdiction of the Courts of Ontario.

Severability: Any determination that any portion of these Terms and Conditions is unenforceable or invalid shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any of the remaining provisions.

Class Action Waiver: By making a CG Journeys booking, each passenger expressly waives any right to commence or to participate in any class action against or involving CG Journeys, and each passenger expressly agrees to opt out of any class action that may be commenced by another person.

Acknowledgment: The passenger hereby acknowledges having read and understood these Terms and Conditions (as may be modified as set forth above) which shall govern the relationships referred to herein.

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
